

We gather together this morning by making the sign of the cross.



Sign of the Cross and Gather



The soldiers broke the legs of the first man but when they came to Jesus they found he was already dead and did not break his legs. Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side, bringing a flow of blood and water. These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: "Not one of his bones will be broken," and "They will look on the one they have pierced."
