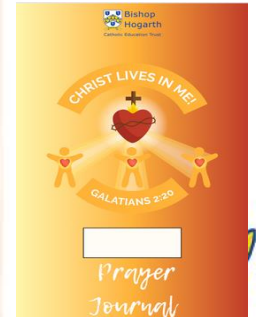

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemass)

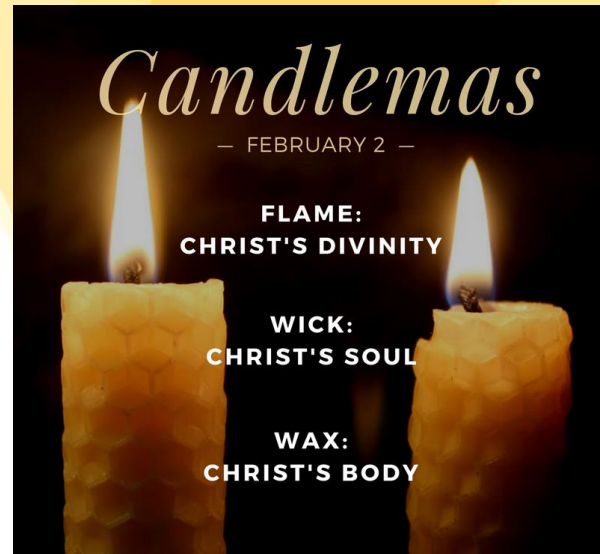
SIGN OF THE CROSS AND GATHER

Forty days have passed since we celebrated the joyful feast of the Nativity of the Lord and today is the blessed day when Jesus was presented in the Temple by Mary and Joseph. Being presented at temple was a customary tradition, however unbeknown to Jesus, he was fulfilling the prophecy that a messenger would come and prepare the way of the Lord. Because Simeon referred to Jesus as the one who brings light to all nations, candles are lit this day to signify the light of Christ and the light his love will bring.

BLESSING YOUR CANDLE

If you have a class candle, please light it and pray the following:

O God, true light, who create light eternal, spreading it far and wide, pour, we pray, into the hearts of the faithful the brilliance of perpetual light, so that all who are brightened in your holy temple by the splendour of this candle may happily reach the light of your glory.
