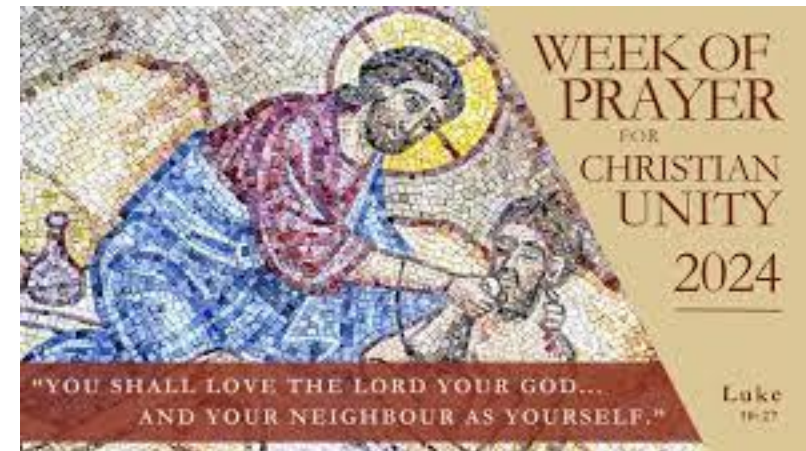
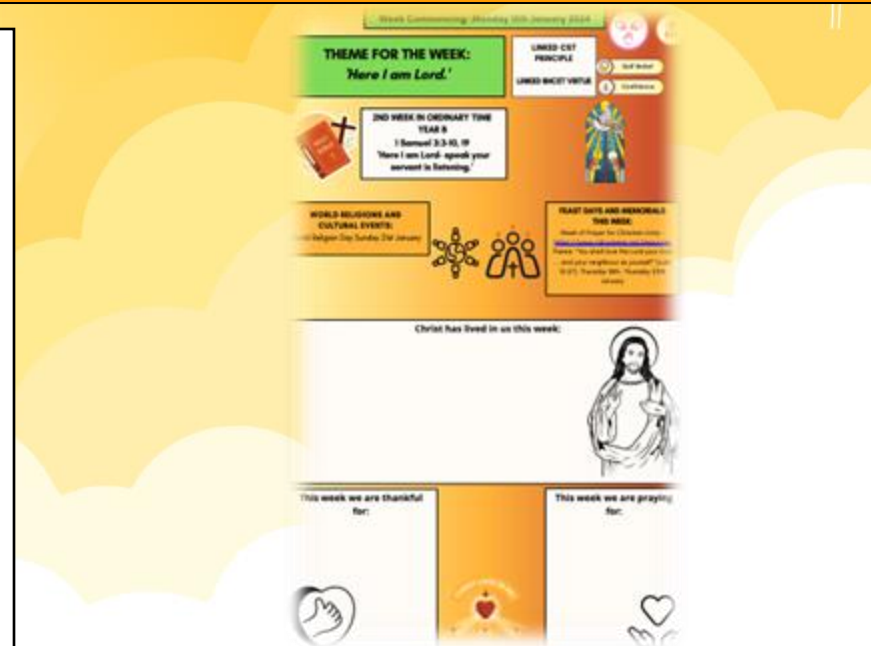
Christians in Burkina Faso, facing crisis, embody this call, working across denominational lines for peace amidst adversity.

The EXAMEN

Awareness: Quietly sit and feel God's presence, reminding you of the week's theme: "Love your neighbour as yourself."

Gratitude: Look back on the week with thanks. Remember times you felt connected to others, moments you extended kindness, and when you received it.

Emotions: Reflect on your feelings. When did you feel joy in unity? When was it hard to show love? Embrace all these emotions as part of your growth.

Prayer: Focus on an instance when you truly felt the meaning of the scripture in action. Pray about it, asking God to deepen that love within you and to help you show it more.

Forward Look: Anticipate the coming week. Seek God's guidance to live out this commandment, making "love your neighbour" an active part of your daily life.
