We celebrate the Solemnity of St George, the Patron Saint of England today. A Christian martyr, St George represents traditional English loyalty and bravery, even though he wasn't English, and probably never set foot here!

His emblem is a red cross on a white background, which is England's flag.

Legend has it that St George slayed a dragon and saved a princess when he was a soldier in the Roman army. The dragon could represent evil.

The Reflection

George was apparently born in Cappadocia – the area now known as Turkey around the year 280.

As a soldier, he quickly rose through the ranks of the Roman army. However, he protested against the pagan Emperor's persecution of Christians and was later imprisoned, tortured, dragged through the streets and beheaded in Palestine on April 23, 303.

He stayed loyal to his faith until the very end - and apparently the Emperor's wife was so inspired by his bravery that she too became a Christian, and was also executed.






The Word A reading from the Gospel of Mark
